Alabaster - CaSO₄·2H₂O

Hardness = 2 (gypsum). Cleavage: not reported. Very soft; avoid all metal tools. Poor water solubility; clean normally with water. Derust with dilute oxalic acid or ammonium oxalate, but limit exposure time to prevent damage to polished surfaces. Sonicate with some NH₃ to remove grease and oils. Avoid acids, caustic alkalis, strong cleaning agents and heat. Soak in clean or water, *briefly* then rinse and dry. For obstinate stains - probably residues from handling - try acetone or alcohol (95–100% ethanol or 99% rubbing alcohol). See also Gypsum.
