

Cerite-(CeCa) - $(\text{Ce}_7\text{Ca}_2)\square\text{Mg}(\text{SiO}_4)_3(\text{SiO}_3\text{OH})_4(\text{OH})_3$

Hardness: 5.5. Cleavage: No data. Insoluble in water. Slowly attacked by HCl with gel formation. Attacked by other acids.

'Cerite' may refer to cerite-(CeCa) or ferricerite-(LaCa).
